SHARED PATHS

Are for the use of both pedestrians and bike riders. They are designated by images of a pedestrian and a bike on the pavement or on a street sign.

On a shared path:

- Pedestrians **always** have right of way.
- Slow down and ring your bell early to warn of your approach.
- Ride in a safe and courteous manner.
- Smile, wave or say 'thank you' as you pass.

1 BAFFI & MO

'Baffi' is Italian for moustache and this bustling cafe is on everyone's lips. Their signature dish is Eggs Baffi with roasted mushrooms, feta, spinach and hollandaise but their potato stack is fast assuming legend proportions. The room is dominated by a communal table packed with caffeine fans while their outdoor tables are great for a pit-stop and a people-watch mid-ride. 94 Redfern St, Redfern

2 EATHOUSE DINER

Is it a tattoo parlour? Or a bordello? Either way, cyclists and Redfern gentry are clamouring for space in this luridly turquoise room specialising in retro treats and plastered with pictures of 70s glamour models. 3 CAFE NOOKIE

Sydney's smallest cafe has a big heart. Two milk crates constitutes the entirety of their eat-in options but the treat here is to roll-up and takeaway – their coffees and cakes are sensational, testified to by queues down the street. 268b Cleveland St, Surry Hills

4 STRANGERS WITH CANDY

Cozy and buzzing, SWC was cool

long before this end of town caught up. With its rich comfort food – slow-cooked pork belly, crab spaghetti and tea-smoked salmon are house favourites – it's perfect for a quick bite, a mid-trip treat or a longer graze, be it indoors in the shabby-chic dining room or al fresco in their courtyard. 96 Kepos St East Redfern

5 REMY & LEE'S

A real favourite of bike riders, R&L's is a no-frills cafe doing A-grade coffee and classic cafe fare like banana pancakes and lamb shank pie as well as sweet treats like ginger ninjas from Black Star Pastries and pear fringapini tart that'll have you needing a new bike seat – luckily there's a range of bikes and assorted accessories on-site. 547 Bourke St, Surry Hills

6 FOUR ATE FIVE

Why did four eat five? Cos five had just eaten the amazing pulled pork sandwich at this award-winning cafe. Great burgers (served with golden skin-on chips) and superlative salads with amazing milkshakes make it a must-see for every bike-fan in need of carb-loading. 485 Crown St, Surry Hills

7 FORMAGGI OCELLO

Cycling to a picnic in the park with a ripe wedge of cheese and a fresh baguette in your basket sound good? Stop here where there's cheese as far as the eye can see, most of it imported from Italy, France and Spain. Part-cafe, part-wine shop (they're licensed), this rustic homage to fromage is great for a stop-off or a sweep-through. 16/425 Bourke St, Surry Hills

8 MISS CHU

Best rice paper rolls in the city? If the crowds and queues are indicator, it's highly likely. Miss Chu is Sydney's worst-kept secret – her rolls stuffed with slender threads of flesh and zinging sprouts and shoots are amazing. Washed down with strong Vietnamese coffee or coconut and cucumber juice, you'll be sitting pretty in the saddle. 150 Bourke St, Darlinghurst

9 KLINK

Golden Cobra coffee roasted in Sydney, named for local legend punk bands and Hitchcock films served from a former police lock-up (hence the name), this is some of the best coffee on the 'black mile' that is Clarence Street. 281 Clarence St, Sydney

10 ROB'S COFFEE LOUNGE

Comfy and cool, Rob's wireless-enabled cafe deals in a decadent line of cakes and an exotic range of gourmet wraps, cheese and fruit platters. 1 Pyrmont Bridge Rd, Pyrmont

Just off Union Street cycleway, this swish cafe dishes up fresh produce, fast service and exceptional Anonimo espresso. The mod-Oz menu is always changing, each incarnation bettering the last. 22 Union St, Pyrmont
